ROADMASTER'S REPORT

ITEMS IN TOWNSHIP RIGHT OF WAYS

The Township Roadmaster reported several items that are in the right of way of Township roads. Letters will be sent requesting removal of the items. If they are not removed the Township will take proper action to remove the items so roads can be safely maintained. This includes but is not limited to basketball hoops, cars, boats, and trailers. *This is for the entire year, not just winter months.* (See article at the bottom of the page for more information on Right of Ways)

ROAD MAINTENANCE

Middle Paxton Township has approximately 40 miles of roadway to maintain throughout the year and especially during the winter season. The Township encourages common sense practice when traveling or cleaning driveways etc. during and following storm events, be it large or small. An Ordinance was adopted this year stating that **if a Snow Emergency is Declared, all vehicles must be removed from Township Roads**. If they are not moved the owner of the vehicle may be cited. Absence of parked vehicles facilitates plowing and cindering operations.


Please **DO NOT BLOW OR THROW SNOW OR LEAVES BACK INTO THE ROADWAY!** This can potentially lead to an accident and is unlawful. I know it's the easy way out, but it is not the legal way out. It is illegal to blow leaves, branches, lawn clippings etc., in the roads. All the debris will clog the stormwater drains and lead to flooding that can cause road damage, cracks and potholes. In addition, the leaves can become slick when they get wet which can lead to accidents.

TOWNSHIP ROADS AND RIGHT OF WAYS

Township Roads do not stop at the paved area, there are additional right of ways on both sides of the road. See image below. In addition, the right of way width varies, some roads may have a 33' right of way while others a 40' or even a 50' right of way. The right of ways are not to place items such as basketball hoops, boat or car trailers, recreation vehicles, wood piles, mulch piles, etc. This area is to remain open for road maintenance. Letters will be sent to all residents who have objects in the right of ways for removal. This is especially critical during the winter season. Plow drivers should not have to worry about dodging items while plowing at 2:00 AM during a snow storm. Also, you may be responsible if any Township equipment is damaged from hitting any object while maintaining the roads. (See Figure 1)

Also, if you are having work performed at your house including lawn maintenance, the contractor is not permitted to place any equipment, dumpsters, porta pots, trailers, and construction materials on the Township road or right of way. Township Roads are not for your use to place items!

Please observe and adhere to posted speed limits and stop signs

Please observe and adhere to posted speed limits and stop signs, especially in development areas and school bus stops. The Township recently received complaints of people not adhering to stop signs, especially in areas where bus tops are located. The roadcrew also noticed residents are not stopping at the intersection of Denison Drive and Elizabeth Avenue. Another area of concern is the intersection of Stoney Creek Drive and Vesta Drive. Please be careful and adhere to all road signs in all areas of the Township and Borough, especially in areas as mentioned above.

In addition, please take precaution when warmer weather arrives for walkers, and bicyclists; especially in areas of Parks and when the Dauphin Pool opens. Also, this message goes out to walkers, runners, and bicyclists of all ages. Please know the rules of the road for bicycle safety and pedestrian safety by visiting PennDOT.gov; Parents please teach your children safety when traveling along roads.

From the Zoning Officer's Desk

Thank you to all residents and business owners who have contacted the Township Office to inquire if permits are required for various projects. It is better to know this information beforehand than to be in violation and have to remove a structure or sign or have an illegal business. Please keep in mind most projects need a permit; building, zoning or both. This includes but not limited to fences, gazebos, sheds, chicken coops, run-in sheds, decks, garages, concrete/paver patios and pools whether it is built on-site or brought on a truck and placed on your property.



Have a business in mind you are thinking about starting or thinking about purchasing a property for sale to start a business? Permits and approvals are required for businesses. Please contact the Township Office to discuss the process and procedures, and all the facts about Zoning and businesses. PLEASE KEEP IN MIND, not all businesses are permitted in every district throughout the Township.

If you are thinking of that perfect Spring/Summer project, we look forward to working with you on your property improvement projects! Please do not hesitate to call us with any questions. The old saying, 'build it and beg forgiveness later' may cost you in fines and the removal of the project. With google earth and GIS capabilities, it is easy to see what is new compared to what was originally constructed according to Dauphin County Property records. The Zoning Officer can be reached at the Township Office 717-921-8128 ext. 106.

In addition, a **Stormwater Management Plan** is required for projects over 1,000 square feet, (cumulative of all projects). This includes but is not limited to pavement projects, sidewalks, concrete patios, swimming pools and decks. This is a State mandated ordinance that was adopted to essentially control run off that eventually ends up in the Chesapeake Bay.



ZONING NEWS

Please note, In the near future, there will be specific days of the week the Zoning Officer will be available to answer questions and help you with your zoning questions and zoning permits. We hope this will help to give you more individualized attention.

Appointments are <u>highly recommended</u>, and walk-ins may be asked to call or email to make an appointment. Please contact the Township Office at (717) 921-8128 ext. 106 and leave a message and your call will be returned or email questions to middletpaxtontwp@comcast.net.

In addition, all zoning questions, including technical questions in regards to zoning permits, must be deferred to the Zoning Officer.





TOWNSHIP NEWS





The **Township** has a process in place to help address and possibly remedy certain types of issues. In order for the Code Official to review and address complaints, a complaint form must first be completed, giving details about the concern, the location and your contact information. Anonymous complaints will not be addressed. A complaint form can be picked up at the Township office, mailed or emailed to you. Only complaints registered in this manner will be addressed. Once a completed and signed complaint form is received by the Township office, it will be reviewed and if warranted, a letter will be sent to the offending property

owner(s) with copies of the applicable ordinances included. In most cases, this step is all that is needed to resolve an issue; however, if after repeated contact a resolution is not reached, a Notice of Violation may be issued with possible fines. A complainant may be asked to testify in court if the complaint is not remedied and if a civil complaint is filed at the Magisterial District Justice's office. Please contact the Township Office at (717) 921-8128 ext.108, leave a message and your call will be returned. Appointments are required if you would like to discuss your concerns at the Township Office or leave a message anytime at the above referenced phone number and extension. If you feel your call is of an urgent matter, please ask to speak to the Township Manager.

- South Central Alert System or Everbridge Alert System. This is used to alert residents of immanent weather issues, or other local emergencies in the area. To receive alerts you are urged to register through https://alert.pa.gov. You can sign up to have alerts sent in various ways, using your home phone, text messages to cell phone, or emails sent to a computer.
- If you have a power outage in your area, contact PPL @ 1-800-342-5775. If your whole neighborhood is out, the more residents that call in and report an sue the quicker they will respond. So have your neighbors call in also. Do not assume if only one residence calls that PPL will know the entire area is without power.



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Emergency Management

- **Prevention**: preventing, avoiding or stopping a threatened or actual act of terrorism.
- **Protection**: protecting our citizens, residents, visitors, and assets against the greatest threats and hazards in a manner that allows our interests, aspirations, and way of life to thrive.
- **Mitigation**: mitigating the loss of life and property by lessening the impact of future disasters.
- **Response**: responding quickly to save lives, protect property and the environment, and meet basic human needs in the aftermath of a catastrophic incident.
- **Recovery**: recovering through a focus on the timely restoration, strengthening, and revitalization of infrastructure, housing, and a sustainable economy, as well as the health, social, cultural, historic, and environmental fabric of communities affected by a catastrophic event.

Listed above are the responsibilities of your Emergency Management Coordinator. We plan for both manmade and natural disasters or incidents. We work with other responding agencies to help prepare, respond and recover. Volunteers are needed to fill positions to assist in planning, administrative duties, HAM Radio operators, or meeting with representatives from federal, state, and local officials.

Training sessions are held locally and on-line.

Borough of Dauphin Rental Units Inspection Program

The **Borough** is in full swing with the inspections for all residential rental units within the **Borough**. The inspections are being done in accordance with the requirements of **Chapter 11**, known as the

Rental Properties Maintenance and Housing Occupancy Ordinance of the Borough of Dauphin.



A letter has been sent to all property owners of residential rental units requesting dates for inspection of all units. The purpose of the inspections is to make sure that the rental units meet the minimum requirements of being safe and in good condition.

The **Codes Enforcement Officer** will be checking to make sure that the units are safe and sanitary, that they have working smoke detectors on every floor, that all of the windows and doors are in good working order and that there are no other safety concerns such as

electrical, plumbing, heating and so forth.

Information about the requirements of **Chapter 11** can be found by logging onto the Borough's website at www.dauphinborough.org and clicking on the Government tab, then click on the Code of Ordinances and scroll down to **Chapter 11**. Keep checking back to the website for the latest information on the rental inspection program.

Rental Unit property owners are reminded that they will need to file a new Status of Occupancy Report with the **Borough** within 15 days of any change in the status of tenants, such as move outs, move ins or any vacancies.

CONTROL BURNING OF LARGE BRUSH PILES



No lawn service companies are permitted to utilize the brush site. Violators will be prosecuted.

D.A.S.T

DAUPHIN AREA SENIOR TRANSIT



D.A.S.T. is an acronym for an organization that provides transportation for residents of Dauphin Borough and Middle Paxton Township who are 55 years of age or older. Dauphin Area Senior Transit provides transportation to medical appointments, beauty shops and all kinds of shopping for seniors who no longer drive or have any other means of transportation.

D.A.S.T. partners with Dauphin County Area Agency on Aging to provide this service. They have established the guidelines by which we operate and certify the drivers through checks with PennDOT on the driver's driving record to insure they

are safe and responsible drivers. D.A.S.T. is responsible for all operating costs, oil changes, tires, repairs and inspections. We also are responsible for the replacement of the van as needed. All of these expenses are covered by donations from our riders. There are no set fees and donations are accepted in any amount based on what the rider feels he/she can afford.

We not only get support from DCAAA, we also get help for Dauphin Borough and Middle Paxton Township whose generous support keeps us rolling. A special THANK YOU to Kim and the staff at the Township office who fields the calls from our riders and notify the drivers the next day.

As **D.A.S.T.** begins its 30th year, we bid adieu to Ray Dively, driver, president and secretary for the past 29 years. Ray has been with **D.A.S.T.** since day one. 

StrongWomen/Growing Stronger Classes in Middle Paxton Township

The StrongWomen/Growing Stronger classes are held Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings for 6 weeks from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM at Dauphin County Agriculture and Natural Resources Building, 1451 Peters Mountain Road, Dauphin, PA 17018.

The StrongWomen program is a safe, effective strength-training and nutrition program for individuals who have been active or sedentary for the past few years and are interested in improving their health. Registration fee is \$50.

Dr. Miriam Nelson of Tufts University founded the StrongWomen program based on her research that proved women from age 35 can start to lose 1/4 to 1/3 pound of muscle each year and gain that much or more in fat. Over time the loss of 2% of strength per year results in weak

muscles and difficulty moving. When this happens, physical activity slows, which leads to more loss of muscle mass and a sedentary, dependent lifestyle.

StrongWomen instructors guide participants, while wearing ankle weights and holding hand weights, through repetitive movements. The goal is to return strength, flexibility and endurance, all lost in the aging process. The nutrition component of the program emphasizes eating for proper weight maintenance. Physician referral forms may be required for enrollment.

Individuals who have participated in the program report having become more active. Ellie, of Middle Paxton Township, said "When I had knee surgery recently both my surgeon and my physical therapist said that my regular exercise routine allowed me to get through the surgery better and recover faster." Donna, a township resident, writes "As a breast cancer survivor taking an anti cancer medicine which depletes calcium in my body, I have found the StrongWomen exercises, along with regular calcium supplements, actually improved my bone density. These results were noted from one Dexascan to another the following year."







You Could be Eligible for a Property Tax or Rent Rebate

By State Rep. Sue Helm (R-Dauphin/Lebanon)

Application forms for the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue's Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program are available for eligible residents to claim rebates for property taxes or rent payments they made last year.

Eligible participants can receive a rebate of up to \$650 based on their rent or property taxes paid during tax year 2016, but supplemental rebates for certain qualifying homeowners can boost the amount to \$975. The program benefits eligible state residents who are 65 years or older, widows and widowers 50 years or older, and those 18 years or older with disabilities.

Eligibility income limits for homeowners are set at the following levels, excluding 50 percent of Social Security, Supplemental Security Income, and Railroad Retirement Tier 1 benefits:

- \$0 to \$8,000, maximum \$650 rebate (homeowners and renters).
- \$8,001 to \$15,000, maximum \$500 rebate (homeowners and renters).
- \$15,001 to \$18,000, maximum \$300 rebate (homeowners only).
- \$18,001 to \$35,000, maximum \$250 rebate (homeowners only).

There is no charge to apply for a rebate. Residents are reminded that they need not pay a private entity for assistance in filing the forms. Copies of the forms are available at my district offices at no cost. One office is located at 2090 Linglestown Road in Susquehanna Township (717-651-0100). The other office is located 260 Market St. in Millersburg (717-692-0833).

Forms are also available from Department of Revenue district offices, local Area Agencies on Aging and senior centers. In addition, applications are available online at www.revenue.pa.gov or by calling 1-888-222-9190.

Claimants must reapply for rebates every year because rebates are based on annual income and property taxes or rent paid each year. Spouses, personal representatives or estates may file rebate claims on behalf of claimants who lived at least one day in 2016 and met all other eligibility criteria.

The deadline to apply for a rebate is June 30, 2017. Rebates will be distributed beginning on July 1, as specified by law.

More than \$264 million in property tax and rent rebates have been sent to more than 554,000 homeowners and renters across the state for taxes and rent paid in 2015.

Since the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program's inception in 1971, older and disabled adults have received more than \$6.5 billion in property tax and rent relief. The program is funded by the Pennsylvania Lottery and revenue from slots gaming.




