2018 ROAD PROJECTS

Earlier this year the Township Supervisors granted approval to bid out a few road projects. One such project was to pave the remaining section of Stony Creek Road located in Middle Paxton Township, which just recently occurred. This was a multi-year project, completed jointly by the Township and Borough, paving the entire length of Stony Creek Road because it spans both Municipalities.



On behalf of both Municipalities we would like to thank the Department of Community and Economic Development and especially the **Dauphin County Commissioners** who approved a Grant to aid Dauphin Borough in the paving of their section of Stony Creek Road. We truly appreciate and are very grateful for this muchneeded Grant.

The second road project will be the seal coating of sections of roads throughout the Township. The list of roads are as follows: Blue Mountain Parkway, Denison Drive, Hunt Meadow, Hunt Glen, and Hunt Wyd. This process involves an approved chip and seal method per PennDOT Publication 408. Please drive slowly and with caution through these areas during the seal coating process. The date the project will commence (weather pending) will be posted on Facebook and the Township Website as far in advance as we are notified.

Please note, the cost of the above projects exceeded \$400,000. The Township receives funding each year, per mile of Township roads, from the State to aid in the maintenance of municipal roads. It took over three (3) years to save the amount needed to finish the paving on Stony Creek Road, and the seal coat project.

Please keep in mind Middle Paxton Township is **one of two** municipalities in Dauphin County that **does not** collect a real estate tax assessed on each property.

Lastly, I would like to thank the Township roadcrew for all their hard work throughout the year in helping with many projects, in addition to the road projects and providing winter maintenance 24/7 to help keep us safe during our travels throughout the Township.

FROM THE MANAGER

Many municipal projects have occurred over the years with funding, partial or in full, coming from Grants.

- The Hagy Park Walking/Fitness Trail was partially funded by a DCNR Grant (Department of Conservation and Natural Resources). The fitness trail is Phase I of a two-phase project, with additional trails, and other amenities planned if another Grant is successful.
- **Joint Shared Salt Shed** The **Salt Shed** that was erected at the Maintenance Garage was a Grant approved by the Dauphin County Commissioners. The **Salt Shed** serves both the Township and Dauphin Borough.
- Fishing Creek Community Center The Fishing Creek Community Center, located at 1361 Fishing Creek Valley Road, has received a number of grants. A new roof, repointing of the bricks, security cameras and a generator installed; these were projects completed over the past few years. At this time a new handicap ramp, front and side porch roofs, new doors, are being installed and the parking lot will be paved. The Community Center, built in approximately 1920 as a 2-room school house has been transformed over the years but still has the school room character by keeping some of the historic values such as the original chalk boards and old fashioned water fountain. The next Township Meeting is scheduled to be held at the Fishing Creek Community Center, October 1, 2018. Come Join Us!
- Roof Mounted Solar Panels You may have noticed the Solar Panels on the roof of the Joint Municipal Building. There are approximately 223 panels that serve to lower the electric bills to the entire building including the Fire Company.
- **Joint Municipal Building and Fire Company** The Township received grant funding over multiple years that helped reduce the debt to the loan to construct the building. The 10-year loan was paid off in 5-years with the aid of the Gaming Grants.
- Tree Vitalization Grant The trees and plants around the joint municipal building and along the front of the building on Peter's Mountain Road were purchased with the funding through a partnership with DCNR.


Other grants were also obtained and used to update the Zoning Ordinance of Middle Paxton Township, complete a Joint Comprehensive Plan with Dauphin Borough and purchase new playground equipment at the Dauphin Middle Paxton Park. Grants take time to write and are not always successful. Without them, many projects could not have been completed or undertaken. We are very thankful and fortunate for the grants we have received over the years to help fund important projects for the community. Thank you to staff and everyone who assists with the grant applications and to the Supervisors who give their full support to make Middle Paxton Township a great place to live and grow!





FROM THE ROADMASTER

TOWNSHIP ROADS AND RIGHT-OF-WAYS



If you are having work performed at your house, including lawn maintenance, neither you nor your contractor are permitted to place any equipment, trailers, dumpsters, porta-johns, or construction materials on **Township Roads** or within the road right-of-way that are posted no parking. The **Township Roads** are not to be used for these purposes! **Violators will be asked to remove these items.**

DO NOT blow or throw leaves, grass or snow back onto road surfaces. This can potentially cause an accident and is <u>unlawful</u>. DO NOT throw leaves, tree and brush trimmings etc. in drainage swales. This leads to clogged storm drains and potentially flooding of roads. Those caught placing debris in these areas will be asked to remove the items.

Township **Ordinance 2016-05** addresses parking regulations, placing of matter on roadways, sidewalk maintenance and clearing of hydrants and penalties for violations when a **Snow Emergency Declaration** is place.

As cold weather is approaching, snow and ice will not be far behind. To help keep the roadcrew safe and equipment free of damage a Township road assessment will be performed noting all properties that have items in the Township right of way. Letters will be sent requesting items to be removed; from cars to basketball hoops. You may be liable for any damage that may occur to municipal property or personnel due to items left in the right of way.

STOP SIGN ORDINANCE 2018-02 —STONEY CREEK MANOR

A Stop Sign will be installed at the intersection of Middle Street and Vesta Drive. The Supervisors adopted an Ordinance 2018-02 on September 4, 2018, to install the stop sign per the regulations of PennDOT for safety purposes. Please note the location of the sign during your travels and obey all traffic signs.

Registering online is the quickest and easiest method. However, you may also complete a paper registration form which is available from your county emergency management office.

Note: All registration information is maintained on a secure server and will NOT be distributed or disseminated to ANY individual or other organization!



South Central ALERT



We have made it through the rainy summer. The weather forecasters are predicting a mild winter. **Be prepared** for anything...this is only a prediction! Stock up on potable water, fuel for generators, and canned goods in the event of heavy snows, long-term power outages, etc.

The Township and Borough have entered into agreement with the **South Central Alert System**. This system allows us to notify residents of any issues during a disaster emergency. Messages can be sent out to the entire Dauphin-Middle Paxton community or directed to a specific neighborhood or area of concern. Messages will be short and to the point.

Some of the notifications can include **road closures**, **flood or tornado warnings**, **shelter locations**, **evacuation information**, or other general information as needed. The system will automatically call your landline telephone if it is listed in the white pages of the phone directory. To receive messages on your cell phone, via text or email, **please register** them at the website provided.



FROM THE DESK OF THE ZONING OFFICER

To all the Township residents and business owners who have contacted the Township Office to inquire about whether or not a **permit** is required for a project –

THANK YOU! It is better to know this information beforehand than to be in violation and have to remove a structure or sign.



Most projects require a permit - either building, zoning or both. This includes, but is not limited to **sheds**, **decks**, **fences**, **additions**, **chicken coops** and **pools**, whether built on-site or brought to the property on a truck.

Are you thinking about starting a business or purchasing a property to start a business? **Permits and approvals are required for businesses.** Please contact the **Zoning Office** to discuss the process and procedures. Not all businesses are permitted in every Zoning District within the Township. If you are thinking of starting a project, we look forward to working with you on your property improvement!

CODES ENFORCEMENT AND COMPLIANCE



The **Township** has several ordinances in place that address issues such as **allowable burning, recyclables, animals running at large** and **dumping of trash.** Outlined below is the Township's process for addressing resident's **concerns** about perceived **ordinance violations**.

- * A **complaint form** must be completed, signed and submitted to the Township office in order for the Codes Official to review and address the complaint. Anonymous complaints will not be addressed.
- * Once a **written complaint** is received, reviewed and an ordinance violation deemed to be warranted, a letter is sent to the offending property owner(s) along with a copy of the applicable ordinance(s.) Names of complainants are **not** released.
- * If after repeated notices, the situation persists, a **Notice of Violation** may be issued and possible fines imposed.
- * If the Township is required to file a **civil complaint** at the Magisterial District Justice's office, a complainant may be asked to testify.

A **complaint form** can be obtained at the Township office or from the Township website. Please contact the Township office (717) 921-8128 ext. 108 with questions.

If your concern is urgent, please ask to speak to the Township Manager.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Township has a contract with **Waste Management of Pennsylvania** for weekly pick up and disposal of residential waste and pick up of recyclable materials throughout the Township. Residents are billed directly by **Waste Management** on a quarterly basis for that service. The Township office sells individual trash tags at a cost of **\$5.30 per tag.** We also sell **18 gallon** recycling containers for **\$10** and **33 gallon** recycling containers for **\$15.**

ALLOWABLE RECYCLABLES FOR COLLECTION ARE:

- Aluminum cans food & beverage containers consisting of aluminum (<u>excludes</u> aluminum foil, trays, and plates).
- Bi-metal cans food & beverage containers consisting of a steel cylinder and an aluminum top & bottom
- Glass bottles, jars or other containers made of clear or colored glass. This includes all food & beverage
 containers made of glass (excludes light bulbs and window or plate glass).
- Newsprint Paper commonly having printed news or other matter of public interest.
- Magazines glossy publications, advertisements and newspaper inserts.
- ◆ High Grade Office Paper bond, copier, letterhead, or mimeograph paper.
- Plastics food, beverage & detergent containers comprised of the following resins: #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and #7.
- Steel Cans food & beverage containers consisting of steel.
- Corrugated Paper cardboard boxes & packaging.



2018 Brush Site

Located behind the Township Public Works Building at 50 Elizabeth Ave.

The **2018 brush site** will remain open through **November 17, 2018**. The cost of an annual permit is **\$50.00**. A one day pass is available for **\$10.00**. A valid photo ID with current address is required when applying for a permit.

This site is for brush trimmings and tree trimmings only! No leaves, bamboo, grass clippings, or ornamental grasses or cut up trees are permitted. Violators will be asked to remove any items dumped that are not permitted. No commercial companies (landscapers) are permitted to utilize the brush site; this is for Township and Borough resident use only.

The site is open **Tuesdays & Thursdays - 7:00 AM - 3:30 PM** and **Saturdays 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM**. Please have your permit handy at all times as there will be random checks. These times are subject to change. If you have any questions, please call the Township Office at 717-921-8128 Monday through Friday, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.

LICENSE YOUR DOG IN PA

All dogs three (3) months or older must be licensed by January 1st of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs. An annual license is \$8.50 and a lifetime license is \$51.50. If the animal is spayed or neutered, the annual fee is \$6.50 and lifetime is \$31.50. Discounts are available to older adults and people with disabilities. The small license fee helps the millions of dogs in the state by funding the Pennsylvania Department of

Agriculture Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement. Dog licenses are available from your local County Treasurer and other licensing agents. For more information go to www.licenseyourdogpa.com.






Next Adopt-a-Highway Trash Pickup: Saturday, October 20 (rain date is November 10)

Protecting Yourself from Identity Theft

State Senator John DiSanto is offering an archived identity theft seminar online at www.SenatorDiSanto.com to help constituents safeguard their identities. The seminars were held in conjunction with Jerry Mitchell, Education and Outreach Specialist for the Office of the Attorney General. The presentation discusses how to prevent identify theft, how to recognize the signs that personal information may have been compromised, and the steps to take if one's identity has been stolen.

Each year, more than 15 million Americans have their personal information stolen, including their name, Social Security number, bank account, or credit card numbers. Scammers use this information to open credit cards or bank accounts, pay for utilities, and steal benefits such as health care or government assistance. Identity thieves steal over \$16 billion from unsuspecting Americans every year.



Having your identity stolen could cost you money, damage your credit score, affect your reputation, and even prevent you from getting a job. Recovering from identity theft can be frustrating, expensive, and time-consuming. While law enforcement is committed to stopping and prosecuting identity theft, the best way to fight it is to avoid it in the first place.

Pennsylvania Prioritizes Critical Investments in Agriculture

The enacted 2018-19 budget plan helps ensure agriculture remains one of Pennsylvania's top industries and continues to help feed the world through programs that address the industry's most pressing challenges. To assist dairy farmers who are battling a changing market, \$5 million will help with research and development programs, along with grants for sustaining the viability of their operations. Pennsylvania dairy farming supports 52,000 jobs and contributes \$14.7 billion to the state's economy.

Another \$3 million will be directed to help combat the spotted lanternfly, an inch-long black, red and white spotted insect native to Southeast Asia that threatens to destroy \$18 billion worth of agricultural commodities, mainly apples, grapes, and hardwoods. This funding will help increase detection and control efforts.

The Pennsylvania Agricultural Surplus Program, or PASS, also received a funding increase to help connect charitable food systems with more farmers willing to provide food to hungry families across the state. Over the past three years, the PASS program has sourced more than 7.2 million pounds of surplus food products that have gone to serve households experiencing hunger in every county of Pennsylvania. PASS is used to offset the picking and packing costs of this surplus product, providing another market for Pennsylvania's growers.


Agricultural education also came out a winner as Penn State Extension and University of Pennsylvania's School of Veterinary Medicine received additional funding while a newly-approved workforce development program known as PAsmart will help prepare students and workers for the 75,000 anticipated job openings in agriculture over the next decade.
