

#### FROM THE DESK OF THE BUILDING CODES & ZONING OFFICER

#### PERMIT REQUIREMENTS



Thinking of **building** a shed or having one delivered? Want to **add** a deck, a fence, or a retaining wall or looking to **add** solar panels or an extra bedroom? Please contact the Township **Zoning Officer** before beginning any of these projects as most building projects **require a permit**. **Permits** are also **required** when **starting** or **changing** a **business** or when **paving** or **resurfacing** a **driveway** that abuts a Township road.

Starting a project without a required permit will result in additional costs.

Call the **Zoning Officer** to **schedule** an **appointment**. **Appointments are required** so that the Zoning Officer can allot adequate time to **answer your questions** and **explain** the process and requirements, **without interruption**. **Walk-ins cannot** always be **accommodated**. The **Zoning Officer** is in the Township office **Monday** and **Thursday** and can be reached at **(717) 921-8128, Ext. 107**.

Please understand that the front desk staff cannot provide you with permit applications or answer your questions. Applications are available on the Township website under "Resources - Applications"



(<u>www.middlepaxtontwp.org</u>) or from the **Zoning Officer**.

#### **CODES ENFORCEMENT AND COMPLIANCE**



**Enforcing** Township ordinances and addressing **complaints** and **violations** is handled by the Township's **Codes Officer**. The **process for filing** a complaint is as follows:

- A complaint form must be completed, signed and submitted to the Township office. Complaint forms are available at the Township office or on our website, <a href="www.middlepaxtontwp.org">www.middlepaxtontwp.org</a>.
   Anonymous or verbal complaints will not be addressed.
- The Codes Official will review all filed complaints and determine next steps. A letter is often times sent to the property owner detailing the concern, along with a copy of the applicable ordinance. Names of complainants are not released.
- If the situation persists, a Notice of Violation may be issued and possible fines imposed.
- If the issue remains unresolved, the Township may file a civil complaint with the Magisterial District Justice. If a civil complaint is filed, the complainant may be asked to testify.

If you file a **complaint** and the **situation persists**, please **contact** the Township office and let the **Codes Officer** know. Too often it is assumed the Township isn't taking action when in fact the Township is **not aware** that the situation has not been resolved.

**Spotted lanternfly** is an **invasive insect** that has spread throughout southeastern **Pennsylvania** and nearby states. Join us for the **Spotted Lanternfly Public Meeting** and learn how to **recognize spotted lanternfly** and what you can do to **help stop its spread**.

Lycorma delicatula, commonly known as the Spotted Lanternfly (SLF), is a new invasive insect that has spread throughout southeastern Pennsylvania since its discovery in Berks County in 2014. SLF presents a significant threat to Pennsylvania agriculture, including the grape, tree-fruit, hardwood and nursery industries, which collectively are worth nearly \$18 billion to the state's economy.

#### PROPOSED ON-LOT SEWAGE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE



The purpose of the proposed Ordinance is to provide for the regulation, inspection, maintenance and rehabilitation of on-lot sewage disposal systems; to further permit intervention in situations which may constitute a public nuisance or hazard to the public health; and to establish penalties and appeal procedures necessary for the proper administration of a sewage management program. It is not intended to force homeowners to install new septic systems or cause undue hardships on homeowners.

An **important factor** in keeping on-lot septic systems **operating properly** and **preventing system failure** is homeowner **maintenance**. By properly managing your on-lot septic system, you are **protecting** your own drinking water and the health of your family. You are also **protecting** water resources in your community. Another important reason for properly maintaining your septic system is money.

Malfunctioning septic systems are expensive to repair or replace. Improper maintenance by a property owner may cause septic system failure. It is far less expensive to maintain your on-lot septic system by having it inspected and pumped on a regular basis than it is to replace a malfunctioning system.

Once the proposed **Ordinance** is enacted, the **Township's Sewage Enforcement Officer** will **monitor** the **maintenance** and **inspections** of all on-lot sewage disposal systems. Notices will be sent to homeowners when routine maintenance and inspection is due. The **Township** and our **Sewage Enforcement Officer** will also work with residents whose systems are identified in need of repair or replacement.

There is still much that needs to happen before this proposed Ordinance is advertised for adoption and implemented so check the Township website for updates or contact the Township Office.

The **Township office** is working on providing **educational material** on basic septic system **functions**, **components**, **reasons for failures**, and steps to **prevent failures** along with **sources for grants** and/or **loans** to **repair** and **upgrade systems**.

The Fire Company is comprised of 40 members. Last year we responded to 238 calls for assistance within the community and to other communities on mutual aide calls. The average response time from dispatch to on the scene was 12.2 minutes. We spent a total of 1,252 man**hours** on scene. Keep in mind we respond from home to the fire station when the call is dispatched. We are always looking for new members. You do not have to be a fire fighter to volunteer. There are other functions you may help at, such as our yearly Community Day/Chicken BBQ.

We are available for fire safety visits to your home, our school, and our day cares within the community. On our visit to Middle Paxton Elementary School, we talked to approximately 300 students and teachers. We spent the day at the school so the children knew who we are and explained what we do as fire fighters.



#### **WASTE MANAGEMENT**

**Middle Paxton Township** has a contract with **Waste Management** for weekly pick up and disposal of residential waste and pick up of recyclable materials. Residents are **billed directly** by Waste Management on a **quarterly basis**.

**Standard Service** 

\$25.59 per month (Sept. 2019 - Sept. 2020)

Standard Service includes 2 large, 30-33 gallon trash bags, unlimited recycling and one bulk item per week. Bags should not be too heavy to lift by one person. Substituting a large bag for one bulk item is not permitted. Extra bag tags can be purchased at the Township office for \$5.30 per tag (cash or check) for excess over the allowable two bags. Residents also have the option of selecting to be a Tag-A-Bag customer.

<u>All</u> Township residents are required to have an account with Waste Management regardless of service arrangement. New residents purchasing an existing home must pay for new recycle bins. Residents who **build a new home** in the Township will receive a **free recycle bin**.

Per Ordinance #53, Middle Paxton Township Municipal Solid Waste And Recycling Ordinance, and Ordinance #67, Recyclables, No Burn Ordinance, recycling is required and is strongly encouraged!

Waste Management will NOT take any items that have Freon in them or that were manufactured to use Freon. They will not take any type of electronics (TVs, computers, copiers, printers, etc.) These items may be taken to the Dauphin County Recycling Center free of charge for Dauphin County Residents. Residents can call Dauphin County Recycling Center at (717) 982-6772 for information on what they accept and any applicable fees. Waste Management does not accept leaves and weeds. The ideal solution is a home compost pile.

#### USE THESE THREE RULES TO RECYCLE RIGHT

It's time to get back to the basics. The fact is that some recycling actions make a bigger impact than others. So please remember these three basic rules the next time you recycle.



Recycle clean bottles, cans, paper and cardboard.

#### **Preparing for the 2020 Census**

The **United States Census** is mandated by the Constitution and has been conducted every ten years since 1790. The **census** is an official, complete count of the American population and records important data about the people residing in our communities.



An **accurate count** is very important as it serves as the basis for **fair political representation** in the **U.S. House of Representatives**. State population counts from the **census** are used to **reapportion seats** across the 50 states and help redraw congressional and state legislative boundaries to meet the one-person, one-vote rule.

**Census data** is also used to **distribute** more than \$675 billion in **annual federal funds** to states and local communities for **health, education, housing**, and **infrastructure programs**. This includes federal funding for programs like **Medicaid, Medicare, SNAP, CHIP**, and **WIC**.

To the extent Pennsylvania residents do not participate in the **census**, it can negatively impact both representation in Congress and essential federal assistance.

**Notices** and **forms** will start arriving in the mail in **March** and for households that do not respond to the census, **nonresponse follow-up** begins in **April 2020**. The **2020** Census will also have an option to be completed online. For more information, please visit <a href="https://pennsylvaniacounts2020.info/">https://pennsylvaniacounts2020.info/</a>.

#### Do I need Real ID?

While **REAL ID** is **optional** for **Pennsylvania** residents, anyone passing through **Transportation Security Administration (TSA) checkpoints** at airports and those who **enter** secure **Federal buildings** on or after **October 1, 2020** will be **required** to have a form of **federally-acceptable identification**. If you do not get a **REAL ID** driver's license, you may use a **valid passport** or **military ID** to board **domestic flights** and enter **Federal** facilities.

You do not need a **REAL ID** to drive, vote, access hospitals, visit the post office, access federal courts, or apply for or receive federal benefits.

Applicants for **REAL ID** may visit a **PennDOT Driver Licensing Center** to present **proofs of identity** and **Pennsylvania residency** in addition to paying a one-time **fee** of **\$30**, **plus** any applicable driver **license renewal fees.** The expiration date of your first **REAL ID** will include any remaining time on your current license plus an additional four years.

#### 2020 Legislative, Economic Updates and Upcoming Events

I'm thrilled to continue my service to the 104<sup>th</sup> District and to Pennsylvania as a whole. There are two main goals I have for 2020: increasing the accountability of Home Inspectors and ensuring that loving, caring parents are not ripped from their children's lives.

House Bill 21 would license home inspectors under the State Board of Real Estate Appraisers, set qualifications for licensure and prohibit unlicensed individuals from conducting inspections or claiming that they are a licensed home inspector. This will protect homebuyers from being forced to spend hundreds of thousands of dollars to fix

hidden problems that were not disclosed to them prior to purchase.

House Bill 1397 would promote equal custodial time for children whose parents are separated or divorced by amending the child custody law to codify the presumption that a child's best interests are served when they spend equal time with each parent, provided that they are not deemed unfit, and would remove language that presupposes the "custodial and noncustodial parent" model of split custody.

I look forward to working with my colleagues to promote these bills and others that will benefit the residents of Pennsylvania.

As Chair of the Urban Affairs Committee, I continue to monitor developments with the Harrisburg Intergovernmental Cooperation Authority (ICA) and the city.

We all want Harrisburg to succeed and, last session, we put the **ICA** in place to help it do so. Act 124 of 2018 allowed Harrisburg to exit Act 47 status while continuing to collect the relevant Local Services Tax and Earned Income Tax for five years.

I am **monitoring** the **city's progress** with the **ICA** in three key areas on their road back to financial stability: sound financial management and reporting; community and economic development; and operational excellence.

We want to make sure the city can stand on its own feet without a perpetual continuation of the extraordinary taxes beyond the five, now four, years it was initially allowed.
