On-Lot Sewage Management Program www.www.www

The On-Lot Sewage Management Program, Ordinance 2023-01, went into effect January 1, 2024. The purpose of this ordinance is to ensure all on-lot septic systems throughout the Township are functioning property in order to protect our community and our environment.

Tips to Prevent Malfunctions

- * Have your septic tank pumped every 3-5 years.
- * Avoid putting chemicals/harmful substances in your septic system (oils and grease, harsh drain and toilet bowl cleaners, bleach, pesticides, varnishes/paints/solvents, etc.)
- * Stagger the use of water-based appliances. The less water you use, the less your septic system has to work.
- * Keep anything heavier than your lawnmower off your drain field.

Common Questions Regarding the On-Lot Sewage Management Program

- * I had my system pumped 2 years ago. Do I need to get pumped again? Yes. The owner of any property must have their system pumped within the time period specified in the Township's notification letter, unless the owner can provide the Township with a receipt or other written evidence showing that the tank has been pumped within the past one (1) year.
- * How do I know who is an approved hauler/pumper? The list can be found on the Township website and at the bottom of this page.
- * My hauler/pumper isn't on the list. How do they become an approved hauler/pumper. **Simply have your hauler/pumper contact the Township office at 717-921-8128.**
- * Why does a hauler/pumper need to be approved by the Township? **To protect homeowners and ensure legitimate**, **legally licensed/permitted and properly insured companies are being used**.
- I heard about the new On-Lot Sewage Management Program but I didn't receive a letter. Do I need to send in my last pumping report? No. If you did not receive a letter, you are not in Zone 1. You will receive a letter when your zone is due for pumping. The Zones are as follows: Zone 1- West of 225 to the Western Banks of the Susquehanna River, Zone 2- Clark's Valley, Zone 3- Stoney Creek Valley, Zone 4- Fishing Creek Valley including Front Street, Roberts Valley Road and Greggs Road areas.
- * My letter says 'Never Pumped' but I get pumped routinely. Why? **Because this is a new program and the**Township has never kept record of when resident's pumped previously, the software being used to now track this information has no prior dates to input, therefore it auto filled 'Never pumped'. We understand this is frustrating for some, so we are working to correct this for future letters.

In addition, the roadcrew and/or contractors will be performing road maintenance such as street sweeping, base repair, crack sealing, grading, roadside mowing, and pipe replacements on various roads throughout the Township.

In our ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe and secure work environment, we would like to remind everyone of the importance of adhering to all signage and flaggers providing guidance at all road work projects.

Safety is our top priority, and your operation is essential in creating a secure working environment for everyone. By adhering to signage and respecting the guidance provided by flaggers, we contribute to the well-being of ourselves and our workers. Please **SLOW DOWN**, and let's work together to maintain a safe and productive workplace. **Please check out the Township website for updates on road maintenance and sign up to receive SAVVY CITIZEN notifications.**

The Consequences of Blowing Leaves, Grass, and Snow onto Public Roads

As the seasons change, homeowners often find themselves engaged in various outdoor maintenance activities to keep their properties clean and well-kept. While it's essential to care for your lawn and surroundings, it's equally important to be mindful of how these activities impact the community. One common oversight is the improper disposal of leaves, grass clippings, and snow onto public roads and roadside swales. This seemingly harmless act can have adverse effects on the environment, public safety, and the overall well-being of the community; environmental impact, safety hazards, community aesthetics. Compost your leaves by mowing over them a few times as they provide nutrient-rich soil for your lawn and gardens. By adopting conscientious practices, we can create a cleaner and safer community.

Please do not blow grass and leaves into roadside drainage ditches and swales.

This leads to clogging up basins and results in roadside flooding.



With nicer weather and summer break just around the corner, please be mindful that children will be out and about playing. Please abide by all posted speed limits and be alert, especially around our parks, school and housing developments. An extra minute or two arriving at your destination is well worth ensuring the safety of our children.



Thinking about replacing or adding an addition, deck, shed, fence, pavilion, or patio to your property? Maybe repaving or enlarging your driveway or remodeling your home or garage? Make sure to get a permit from the Township, and if you are unsure whether or not your project requires a permit, **always ask first**. Depending on your project, different applications may be needed. Starting a project without the required permit(s) will result in additional costs. All applications are available on the Township website, <u>www.middlepaxtontwp.org</u>, under **Resources** > **Applications**.

Permit Process:

- Submit a **completed permit application** and **site plan** to the Township office.
- The application is reviewed by the Zoning Officer. If additional information is needed or required, the Zoning Officer will contact you.
- Once approved, the applicant is contacted with the required fees due at pick up.

The Zoning Officer is in the Township office **Monday**, **Tuesday and Wednesday**. Call the Zoning Officer at **717-921-8128**, ext. **107** to schedule an appointment. **Appointments are required** to ensure the Zoning Officer is available and can allot time to answer your questions and explain the process and requirements without interruption. **Walk-ins cannot always be accommodated**.



The Township's **Codes Enforcement Officer** is who handles enforcing Township ordinances and addressing complaints and violations. Residents are encouraged to report issues and concerns because we cannot be everywhere all the time. We ask that if you have a concern or issue, please **start by talking to the other party and try to resolve the matter amicably**. If this step is unsuccessful, please complete the following:

• Submit a complete and signed complaint form to the Township office. For a complaint to be acted upon, it must be submitted in writing. Specific details, such as address of concern, type of animal, breed of dog or cat, make/model of vehicle, must be included in the complaint so that action taken can be specific. Without specific details and information, enforcement cannot move forward. Complaint forms are available at the Township office and on the website, www.middlepaxtontwp.org. Please **do not** call and ask to verbally submit a complaint. **Verbal or anonymous complaints will not be addressed. Names of complainants are not released**. The Codes Official will review all properly filed complaints and determine the next steps.

If you file a complaint and the situation persists, please contact the Township office and let the Codes Enforcement Officer know. Too often it is assumed the Township isn't taking action when we are not aware that the situation has not been resolved.

Consider the pavilion at Hagy Park or the Fishing Creek Community Center!

Rental of the pavilion at Hagy Park includes electric to the pavilion, picnic tables, use of the restrooms, as well as outdoor fun on the playground and sport courts, where basketball, tennis and pickleball can be played.

Fishing Creek Community Center provides an indoor facility with a full kitchen, AC/heat, restrooms, tables and chairs. A playground, sport court offering basketball and pickleball, and a pavilion with picnic tables are also available to use. Pavilion can be rented separate from the indoor facility.

With severe weather comes downed trees. Sometimes these trees inadvertently take power lines down with them. Any trees on power lines must be directed to PPL. **The Township cannot take care of these situations.** PPL advises residents to call 1-800-DIAL-PPL (1-800-342-5775). Never approach downed power lines. Stay at least 10 feet away and keep kids and pets away. Always assume they are energized and carrying electricity.

- Place generators in a dry, well-ventilated outdoor location.
- Generators emit carbon monoxide. Never operate a generator in your home, garage or any enclosed area.
- Use only safety-tested, heavy-duty cords designed for outdoor use.
- Turn off or disconnect all appliances and lights before you begin operating the portable generator.
- Remember to do maintenance between uses of generators: inspect filters, spark plugs, oil and fuel.



Ensure your house number is properly and visibly displayed with a reflective address marker. Reflective address markers help emergency services quickly locate your home in the event of an emergency. Markers can be ordered at the Township office. They are \$20.00 each, available in blue or green and can be made to hang either horizontally or vertically. Order forms are also available on the Township website, www.middlepaxtontwp.org.

What we do have to look forward to is the Spring and Summer storms that will happen. Many times, I have written about how to prepare. Will there be power outages, probably. Flooding, hope not.

But what would you do if either of these occur???

On another note, Spring is the time of year for yard clean up. Bag it – don't burn it. Open burning or yard debris could start a wildfire. Get to know the Open burning policy of the township and borough. Contact their office or go online for a copy. If you do burn the yard waste, do so in a clear area. Have water on hand to control it. A responsible adult should be present at all times of a controlled burn.

Contact Dauphin County Department of Public Safety to give them the location of the controlled burn. (717) 558-6900, non-emergency phone number. Also contact the fire company (717) 921-8242 and give them the information also.

LIFELONG IMPROVEMENT THROUGH FITNESS TOGETHER (LIFT)

Penn State Extension of Dauphin County sponsors a strength training and nutrition program called Lifelong Improvement through Fitness Together (LIFT) in Middle Paxton Township at Dauphin County Agriculture and Natural Resources Building, 1451 Peters Mountain Road.

This training was formerly called StrongWomen. Program meets every Monday & Wednesday for 8 weeks from 8:30 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Physician referral forms may be required for enrollment.

Class fee is \$60.

What are the effects of inactivity? Older adults may be labelled a fall risk or have a reduced quality of life with an inability to age in place. Each class has an active warm-up, targeted exercises using arm and leg weights and ends with a cooldown. The result is to enhance overall functional fitness through improved strength, flexibility, and balance.

Friendly reminder that all dogs 3 months and older are required to be licensed.

Annual licenses are available in person at the Dauphin County Treasure's office which is located at 101 Market Street, Room 105, Harrisburg PA 17101, online at www.PADogLicense.com, through the mail or at an agent location. Our community's closest location is Hornung's True Value at 1000 Peters Mountain Road.

Lifetime licenses are available in person or through the mail and require either a microchip or tattoo.

Licensing is very important. The Dauphin County Treasurer's office maintains a database of licenses that are issued, which enables lost dogs to be returned to their owners more readily. It is also a mandated state law.

Yearly memberships run from Jan 1.—Dec 31

Residents have two service options; Standard Weekly Service or Tag-a-Bag.

- **Standard Weekly Service** (\$160.95 per quarter plus tipping fee) includes two (2) bags or containers less than 36 gallons, and weigh under 50 lbs., unlimited recycling and one bulk item weekly. Residents must contact WM at (800) 634-4595 to schedule a bulk item pickup 24-48 hours in advance.
- **Tag-a-Bag** (Minimum of 20 tags at annual cost of \$530) Residents under the Tag-a-Bag service will be mailed 20 tags from Waste Management and be billed for the amount of those tags at \$530. Tags must be affixed to each and every bag that is put out for removal. Unlimited recycling included. Tag-a-Bag service does not include free pickup of a bulk item. Residents must contact WM at (800) 634-4595 to schedule a bulk item pickup 24-48 hours in advance. Bulk item pickup service is \$40 for each item.

Electronics of any kind will not be taken by Waste Management. Appliances containing refrigerant (refrigerator, air conditioner, dehumidifier) must have the freon removed by a Certified Technician and a sticker of certification must be placed on the unit. No item will be collected without a sticker.

Be mindful that burning of recyclables is a violation of Township Ordinance #67. Residents are welcome to use any type of can or bin for recycling as long as it is clearly labeled as such. The Township office offers free recycle stickers.

Dauphin County Recycle Center is also an option for large items, electronics and appliances that contain freon. For additional information and fees, go to their website:

SOLID WASTE & RECYCLING SERVICE UPDATE

The current Solid Waste and Recycling contract with Waste Management expires on September 30, 2024. As a result of feedback received from township residents, Middle Paxton Township has formed a focus group comprised of volunteers from our community as we prepare to begin the competitive bidding process to solicit proposals for next year's contract. The goal of the focus group is to evaluate potential opportunities to increase competitiveness of the bidding process while maintaining the current level of service for the residents of the Township. One of the items under review is the use of automated collection, which would require all residents to use trash carts provided by the hauler. Many waste removal companies are moving away from so called "manual collection", where bags are collected by hand, to automated collection where wheeled carts are automatically picked up by a metal bar and dumped into the truck. Automated collection is becoming the norm as a consequence of higher labor costs many haulers are experiencing and may result in a more competitive bidding process. We will continue to update the residents on the progress of this new solid waste and recycling services contract.





- ♦ No person shall operate a recreational vehicle on Borough property without the express written consent of the Borough.
- ♦ No person shall store abandoned automobiles on any public or private property in the Borough, unless such automobile is stored in a garage or other similar building. An automobile is abandoned when, for a period of forty-eight (48) hours or more, the automobile is left unattended on any public or private property and the automobile lacks a current state inspection sticker, does not have current registration, does not have an ascertainable vehicle identification number, or the automobile is physically inoperable in its current condition.

Clarks Creek Watershed Preservation Association

Clarks Valley, January 2024: Your Clarks Creek Watershed Preservation Association (CCWPA) has been active in many different ways as we fight to preserve and protect our watershed, which lies in Middle Paxton and Reed Townships of Dauphin County.

2023 Past Activities

Your CCWPA continues to attend Township and Borough meetings and monitor zoning and construction, as part of our commitment to safeguarding the purity of our watershed. Our watershed faces issues such as storm water runoff, the development and installation of impervious surfaces near Clarks Creek, and zoning changes that presage new kinds of challenges to water purity. CCWPA fights to stay knowledgeable, keep informing the public and mobilizing "friends of the watershed" when needed.

At our 2023 Annual Meeting this past September, the CCWPA discussed the new Septic Ordinance affecting Middle Paxton Township. The west end of Clarks Creek is in "Zone 1" (2024) and the east end of Clarks Creek is in "Zone 2," meaning that all septic systems in our watershed in Middle Paxton Township will have to be inspected by the end of 2025. Your CCWPA feels that this is a good thing for the watershed, in that it helps keep septic systems under control, but also recognizes that doing this may be a burden to some homeowners. There was also much discussion of the DeHart Dam, and the CCWPA decided to revisit its attempts to define the inundation zone, disaster access and safety paths, notifications, and more.

Also at our Annual Meeting, our President Paula Zankel reviewed activities of CCWPA during 2023, including the Girl Scouts presentation, presence at all public municipal meetings, and more. Finally, at the meeting, Kyle Kuntz, Sherry McLain, John Mimnall and Paula Zankel were elected by acclamation to two-year terms on the Board of CCWPA, joining Mike Blum, Ryan Evans, Arlene Taylor and Brett Zankel.

Our 24th ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY TRASH PICKUP on Rte. 325 Clarks Valley Road in Middle Paxton Township took place on October 7, 2023. Nine volunteers under the direction of Mike Blum braved the drizzle and picked up 20 bags of trash, 5 bags of recycling and assorted pieces of wreckage, some of which were also able to be recycled (see photos). Once again, our efforts were under the aegis of the "Great American Clean-Up of Pennsylvania."

The CCWPA had its booth at the annual Wildwood Wetlands Festival in April 2023, the Lions Club Carnival and the Ned Smith Festival for Nature and the Arts in July, 2023, and at the Dauphin Historical Society Heritage Day on October 21, 2023. We hope you saw us!

2024 Planned Future Activities

Look for the CCWPA Booth at the **Wildwood Park Wetlands Festival** on April 27, 2024, at Wildwood Park in Harrisburg! You can learn more about how we work to preserve and protect the watershed, and how watersheds help improve our quality of life.

On May 11, 2024 we will hold our **25th ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY TRASH PICKUP SESSION** on Route 325 from 9 a.m.—noon, with a pizza party to follow, starting at 1231 Clarks Valley Road! We are now in our 12th year of keeping trash and garbage out of our watershed, and we look forward to many more years of keeping this going! My office can offer assistance with state government programs and services.

Several newly enhanced state government programs may provide benefits for you or a family you know. My office can provide additional information and guide you in applying for programs for which you may be eligible.


Eligibility for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate program has been expanded in 2024, for taxes and rent paid in 2023. The income cap (with ½ of all Social Security income excluded) for homeowners has been raised from \$35,000 to \$45,000, and for renters from \$15,000 to \$45,000, and the maximum standard rebate has gone from \$650 to \$1,000. The program is open to Pennsylvanians age 65 and older, widows and widowers age 50 and older, and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The deadline to apply is June 30, 2024.

Pennsylvanians who receive the federal Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit can now take a refundable state tax credit on their PA income tax return equal to 100 percent of the federal credit. Eligible individuals that have incurred qualifying care expenses can receive between \$600 and \$1,050 for one dependent and between \$1,200 and \$2,100 for two or more dependents.
